## Welcome - Benvenuto

After many years of planning, dreaming and hard work, St Anne's College opened its doors in 2019. It was way back in the 1990s when, under the leadership of Monsignor Frank Hickey, Parish Priest of St Mel's, and Tom Sexton, Principal of St Mel's Primary School, that the search began for land to establish a new school in Shepparton. It was the foresight of these two men that knew the demand for Catholic Education in Shepparton would grow to capacity. With St Brendan's school full, Notre Dame College growing each year and St Mel's having no room to expand, property in Grace Rd, north Shepparton, was purchased at the instigation of Mons Hickey and Tom Sexton, and now there are three flourishing education communities in that area: St Luke's Primary School, Notre Dame College's Emmaus Campus with a Year 9 programme and the McAuley Champagnat Programme.

The search for an additional school site in Shepparton south began in 2003; this decision was endorsed by Fr Michael Grace: Canonical Administrator, the School Board, Parish Finance Committee and Catholic Education Shepparton Mooroopna group. A parcel of land, 10.18ha (25 acres), had been offered to the parish for \$1,125,000. The Catholic Education Sandhurst Capital Planning Group, under the direction of Philomena Billington, endorsed the purchase of this land on March 15, 2012. The Catholic Education Sandhurst Land Fund funded \$1,025,000.00, with St Mel's Parish making a contribution to the purchase of this land of \$100,000.00.

Before a school could be established, the land needed to be rezoned and subdivided; this was expected to take 12 - 24 months. In 2015, after much investigation, time and resilience, the site in Kialla was approved for an education facility and the then Parish Priest, Fr Joven Lustre, gave the imprimatur for a new school to be established. The school would cater for the needs of St Mel's Parish and serve the Greater Shepparton community. The dream was big - Early Childhood to Post Compulsory Years - a 'one-stop shop' - maternal health services, allied health, day care, kindergarten, primary and secondary education - a place where the needs of the community could be met.

With the appointment of a project control group, consisting of Fr Joven Lustre, Fr Joe Taylor, Tom Sexton (Project Manager), Sr Geraldine Larkins, John Cortese, Kathy Hunt, Dom Poppa, Wendy Baldwin, Ebony Anderson, Annette Jakob, Ken Woodman (Architect), Rob Papworth, Kaye O'Connor, Susan Carroll, Emma Reynoldson, Melissa Hamilton, Miriam Stewart and Arn Gorman, the project gained momentum and Moretto Builders was appointed as the construction firm. Building commenced in August 2017. Three stages of the build are now complete. We continue the journey in 2024 as we grow to add Year 5 and Year 12 levels to our college community and offer our full suite of VCE and VCE VM. 2025 will see a full college when we include Year 6 to our classes. We are so excited for the prospects of the future and are excited to inspire you to become part of that journey.

### **FOUNDATION - YEAR 4**

In the School of Possibilities, we seek to create independent, discerning learners who are ready to take risks and stand up as leaders. Students enter the School of Possibilities ready to explore specialised fields of study and employment pathways. They apply skills as effective collaborators, thinkers, researchers, self-managers and communicators to build knowledge and skills in their chosen fields. Through strong Catholic values, we aim to create socially respectful learners who value diversity and act justly to be stewards of our planet. It is our hope that our students become agents for positive change, in their own lives and in our world.

# School of Innovation

In the School of Innovation, our commitment to faith, wisdom and a learning community that provides challenging and enriching experiences, connected to practical and real life, allows our students to flourish. Within our core teaching teams we use a holistic approach, where students are encouraged to be active contributors to their learning, working effectively with Learning Mentors and peers, supported by Catholic values that guide students toward achieving academic success.

We have committed Learning Mentors and Specialists who engage students in each year group in open and dynamic learning spaces. Within these spaces the Learning Mentors and students share the responsibility of learning through explicit teaching, inquiry and developing learning assets of collaboration, communication, thinking, researching and self-management.

As we engage in the main areas of curriculum learning - English, Math, Science, Religious Education and Physical Education - the interconnectedness of our teaching and learning allows students to be challenged to develop a capacity for self-reflection throughout every Victorian curriculum area. Learning Mentors use a range of creative pedagogical approaches to develop 21st century skills that will help students in their lives beyond St Anne's College.

We encourage students to take risks and know at times the end product isn't what they might have envisioned, but the challenges they faced on the learning journey are just as important. It is about the process of learning within the School of Innovation.





### Our Inquiry-based Learning

#### THE LEARNING MENTOR (TEACHER)

At St Anne's College, teachers will support the learner, the child, to investigate questions, problems, passions and interests about the world both around and within them. As an inquiring school, the learner is a researcher - both in collaboration with others and as an individual. St Anne's College inquiring pedagogy will focus on learning to learn. This sits alongside learning about 'big ideas' that helps us make sense of the world. As an inquiring school, it is the LEARNER that constructs their understandings - moving from the known to the new.
