

Grace, the 'gracious one', 'the loving one'

You have probably heard the expression: The apple does not fall far from the tree. It means that children are often like their parents. Scripture does not tell us anything about the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Tradition tells us that their names were Joachim and Anne. History of St Mel's Parish

St Mel's Parish was established in 1955 and is the second parish in the City of Greater Shepparton. As a growing community with an influx of migrants from many parts of the world, our parish St Mel's was named after St Mel's Cathedral in Longford, Diocese of Ardagh, Ireland.



In 1956 the first building, a Church and School, was blessed and opened on 9th December.

St Mel's School was established in 1957. The school was in the care of the Mercy Sisters who have dedicated their lives to educating and caring for the sick and needy. In 1991 the Mercy Sisters handed over the running of the school to the Parish and the first lay principal was appointed.

In 1969, Bishop Bernard Stewart welcomed the Daughters of Divine Zeal to St Mel's Parish in Shepparton. At that time, Bishop Stewart said, "The opening of this new Kindergarten at St Mel's is a day of rejoicing, thanks to the Daughters of Divine Zeal. Some mothers need to become breadwinners and this new Kindergarten in the Parish will provide help."

The Scalabrinian Fathers played a very important role in the development of St. Mel's Parish. The Scalabrinian's arrived in 1962 and administered to the needs of the many migrant families established in the area, especially the Italian community. After 28 years the Scalabrinian Fathers left St Mel's.

On January 17, 1991 Monsignor Frank Hickey and Fr. Andrew Fewings arrived to take charge of the parish. They were followed by Fr Michael Grace in 2002, Fr Joven Lustre in 2012, Fr Joseph Taylor in 2017 and in 2019 Fr Peter Taylor joined us at St Mel's.



Are you ready for the opportunity of being a part of St Anne's College?

It became apparent in the early 2000's that Shepparton South was growing significantly. Under the direction of the then Parish Priest, Monsignor Frank Hickey, and with the support of the Catholic Education Office Sandhurst, the search for a suitable future school site began.

In 2010 a suitable parcel of land was identified, and contracts to purchase the land were signed in 2012. Settlement took place in November 2014.

The Parish Priest of St Mel's at the time, Fr. Joven Lustre, appointed a Project Control Group (PCG) in 2015 to manage the project to build a co-educational Catholic P-12 school and an Early Learning Centre on this greenfield site in Kialla.

Community Consultation

During 2015 extensive Community Consultation took place to understand what the community was looking for in a new school. A series of consultation meetings took place with:

1. St Mel's Parish Community,
2. Staff of all Catholic Schools in Shepparton and Mooroopna, and
3. Students from St Mel's Primary School and Notre Dame College.

The results of these consultations form the basis of our Master Plan and Educational Provision.

Master Plan

The Master Planning process involved extensive community consultation, school visits and online research. Following three Master Plan options, the final Master Plan was selected to support the pedagogical direction of the school and provide maximum interactions between the students and staff under one roof. It provides for general learning Junior, Middle and Upper learning neighbourhoods along with specialised areas, administration and Chapel.

Structural, services, and landscaping strategies were presented to complement the Master Plan design.

Education Provision

The Master Plan has provision for Early Childhood Education and Care, Before and After School Care, Primary and Secondary Students. The site has the capacity to cater for approximately 1400 students.



Our Catholic Identity

The Catholic identity of St Anne's College manifests itself in a range of ways and serves to inform our vision, policies, priorities and practices. Evidence of our Catholic identity is visible in our leadership, through people's relationships with one another, in high-quality learning programs, in how we respond in times of crisis, in prayer, liturgies, community service and in many more ways of being and doing throughout our day. All members of St Anne's College have the capacity to shape the Catholic identity of our College.

An important contributor to the development of our Catholic Identity is our Religious Education curriculum, a curriculum which promotes the person of Jesus Christ as the foundation and centre of the educational work in Catholic schools. At St Anne's College, we base our Religious Education curriculum on the Source of Life, from Catholic Education Sandhurst. The following is the aim of the curriculum as stated in the CES Diocese of Sandhurst Religious Education Policy (May, 2020)



“The aim of the Religious Education curriculum in the Diocese of Sandhurst is primarily to bring students and young people into personal relationship with Jesus Christ through knowledge of the Gospels and of Catholicism as a lived faith tradition in contemporary Australian and global society. The curriculum also aims to expand a student’s spiritual awareness and religious identity through the development of such key skills as discernment, critical thinking, meaning making, and search for the truth. The Religious Education program then seeks to challenge and inspire to a life of service in the Christian community and in society. The efficacy of Religious Education can be identified by such key indicators as knowledge of Christ and the Christian tradition and commitment to him, as well as service to others through engagement with the Church and the world.” (p.3)

A welcoming and inclusive learning environment

At St Anne's College we aim for the students:

- to be socially respectful, value diversity and act justly


We use a range of different strategies to address these aims. There is an emphasis on positive and preventative strategies, e.g. acknowledging and rewarding good behaviour. There is a clear step-by-step process for dealing with inappropriate behaviour.

We provide a variety of learning spaces, large whole groups gathering spaces, focused tuition areas, smaller studio and study areas, some for quiet play and time to be away from the busyness of the collective.

The framework of School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) approach is the framework used at St Anne's College to support our social behaviour development. SWPBS is an application of a behaviourally-based systems approach to enhance the capacity of schools, families, and communities to design effective environments that improve the fit or link between research-validated practices and the environments in which teaching and learning occurs.

At St Anne's College we believe that all people who participate in our community have the **right** to feel safe and be safe. With that safety comes the sense of belonging, being happy and the opportunities to succeed. It is also our **responsibility** that we make others feel safe.

Our no bullying stance provides the structure to explore appropriate school and social behaviours and to address unwanted behaviours as they may arise. The hope is that we can work together using conflict resolutions skills to solve any issues that may result from unwanted behaviour. Should you or your child feel that in any way you have been the victim of unwanted behaviour, speak to someone about it.



Learning @ St Anne's College

At the heart of the curriculum process are the students themselves who are growing through developmental levels and have various levels of readiness for learning. They bring to school a variety of experiences, previous learning and preferred ways of making sense of the world.

The Victorian Curriculum

Our school, along with all other schools in Victoria, follows the Victorian Curriculum.

The Victorian Curriculum F – 10 sets out what every student should learn during their first eleven years of schooling. The curriculum is the common set of knowledge and skills required by students for life-long learning, social development and active and informed citizenship. As a Catholic College, Religious Education is also part of the curriculum.




